## Do You Know WHERE YOUR COMES FROM?

Do You Know Where Your Art Comes From? is a four-part exhibition series curated by Victoria Reis, Executive & Artistic Director of Transformer, in collaboration with Tim Doud, Associate Professor of Art and Visiting Artist Program Coordinator, Studio Art Program in the Department of Art, American University. Presented over two years at the American University Museum and the Katzen Arts Center, Do You Know Where Your Art Comes From? highlights various contemporary platforms artists and arts organizations have initiated to develop, create, and present art.

Locally Sourced (January 24 – March 15, 2015), the first exhibition in the Do You Know Where Your Art Comes From? series, provides an in-depth look at the extensive collections of six regionally focused CSA (Community Supported Art) and Flat File programs that seek to grow recognition and support for artists in their communities. Locally Sourced features over 300 small works and multiples in a variety of mediums, including drawing, painting, hand silk-screens, digital prints, photography, collage, sculpture, video, and more.

Comprehensively showcasing artists and organizations that incorporate a range of visual art practices, including performative, experiential, social, and pedagogical, *Do You Know Where Your Art Comes From?* investigates current and future models of art organizing. This exhibition series has been inspired by the launch of Common Field (www.commonfield.org) a new network of artist projects and spaces of which Transformer is a Founding Member.
